Session Objectives

- Strengthen participants' knowledge of key building blocks for people-centred early warning systems:

 - 2. Co-creating a collaborative design process
 - 3. **Co-exploring, co-developing, and co-delivering solutions**, including impact-based forecasting for anticipatory action
 - 4. Capacity building and learning
 - 5. Monitoring and evaluation

Session Format
