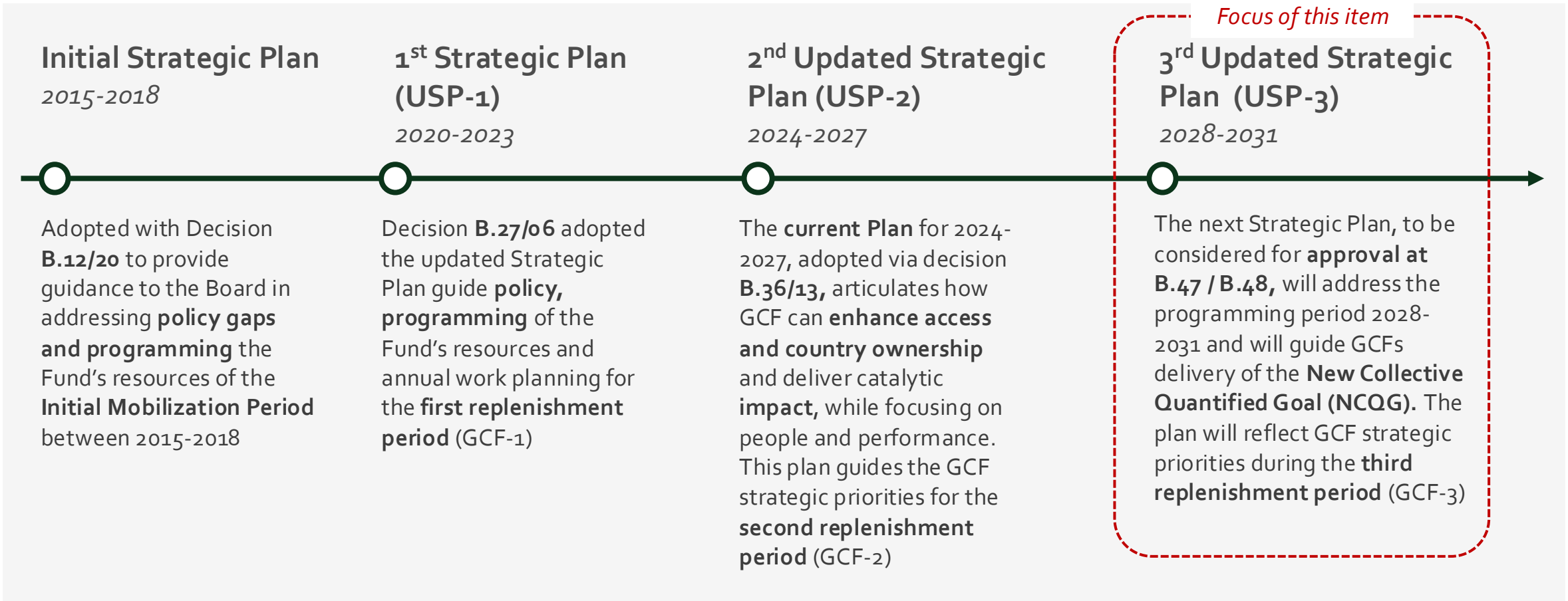

# EXTERNAL EVALUATION OF THE SAP AND CIEWS



- **GCF is now the leading global financier of CIEWS, with ~USD 2 billion invested.** Stronger coordination with CREWS, WMO, SOFF and other partners is needed to maximize impact.
- **While technical capacities have improved, gaps remain in last-mile delivery, user engagement and cross-border coordination.** More user-centered services, stronger community reach and enhanced regional cooperation are needed.
- **Long-term sustainability remains a major challenge.** Many projects finance infrastructure and equipment but struggle long-term, maintenance and institutional capacity beyond project closure, highlighting the need for stronger alignment with national systems and initiatives such as SOFF.
- **Significant potential for CREWS, WMO and GCF to strengthen joint knowledge-sharing and learning.** The report recommends stronger learning and feedback mechanisms across institutions.
- **The CREWS–GCF collaboration is a positive example of successful scaling up approaches,** where strategic partnerships can accelerate the uptake and replication of climate resilience solutions. **Successful SAP projects have generally focused on replicating and scaling proven models rather than piloting untested approaches,** reinforcing the value of building on established solutions

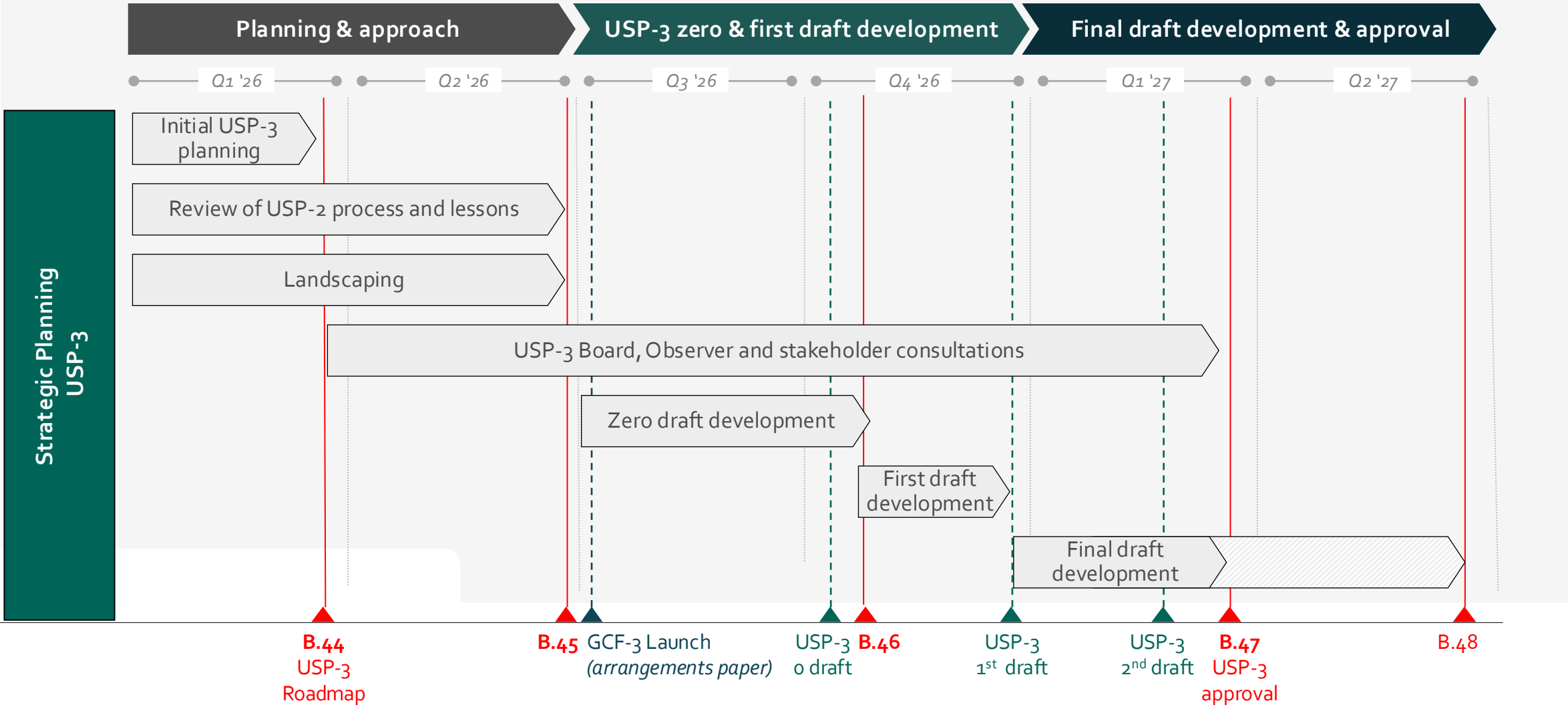


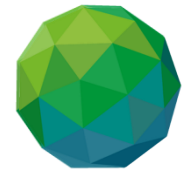
